#### Pastor's Notes;

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

It is hard to believe that I am closing in on the completion of my 3<sup>rd</sup> year serving you as your Pastor. It has been a while since our last news update. The biggest news has been the replacement of our old and outdated heating and air conditioning systems. We had 4 units that were 40+ years old and 1 unit at 26 years old. All 5 units were replaced with high efficiency cold climate heat pumps outside and new air handling units inside. The cost of the project was \$64,534 and was done by Tri-State Plumbing & Heating. We had an additional cost of \$695 for a new access ladder into the Fellowship Hall attic area where 2 of the furnace units reside and the purchase of 1-year supply of furnace filters. We had \$45,229 raised through donations and secured a \$20,000 - 10-year loan from New Albin Saving Bank to complete the financing. Through a separate donation we also retrofitted all of the fluorescent ceiling light fixtures to accept LED bulbs. Both of these projects came out of an energy audit the church had done in the fall of 2024. Included in the energy audit was a discussion about adding a solar energy source to the church. The installation of solar panels was discussed but was tabled for a later time due to cost factors and the need to understand what our new energy consumption will be with the new heating and cooling systems and LED lighting. It should be noted that the LED retrofitting project was done by all volunteer laborers. Bod Protsman, Larry Corwin, and Pastor Buck took the lead on this project. Dixie Corwin and Jean Protsman also helped out. The new attic ladder in Fellowship Hall was also done by volunteers – Larry & Dixie Corwin, Bob Protsman, Ricky Humes, and Pastor Buck.

I personally would like to thank Mary Roeder and Marian Meier for their talented hands in the decorating of the church throughout the year. And yes, Dick and Duane get called into assist as well.

We have a great number of people that volunteer their time and talents – Jean Ann Weymiller & Alice Hansen our pianist/organists, Karen Galema, Angie Colsch, Allison Humes, and Patricia Olson - Sunday School, Ross & Tara Kolsrud – "J" Walkers - Those that our on the Administrative Board ( Chad Winters, Board Chair – Dr. Jane Hasek, Secretary, Jan Stute, Treasurer, Larry Corwin, Trustee, John Verdon, SPRC, Ross Kolsrud, Lay Leader, Tom Duvel, Jean Protsman, Karen Galema, Dixie Corwin, Iva Gaunitz, Doc Weymiller, and Karen Ferring who does needed office work, including the bulletin every week, and many more record keep tasks. I have been blessed by all of you and your faithfulness to God's work.

There is more we can and need to do in Christ's name and I am looking forward to working with you as we travel along Christ's pathway to salvation. Be Blessed and Be a Blessing to Others. Pastor Buck.

Seeing the thought they put into what they think would be most helpful to needy families is something you should all get to experience. When you ask them why they chose a specific item the answers you get are heartwarming. At the moment we are working on a 5-week Easter lesson and will finish that up Easter Sunday with an egg hunt before our lesson for the week. Our last day of Sunday school for this year will be May 11. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents for getting their kids to Sunday school and for your participation in all our activities and for donating to all our extra's (shoeboxes, meals, giving tree, penny party, etc.).

You are setting an amazing example of God's love through your actions. ## **High School Youth Group:**

Our vision is to respond to the social and spiritual needs of the youth within our church and community by providing relative programs, activities, missions and events that will allow them to build a strong foundation of faith that will enable them to express and share their own words, actions and deeds; to encourage them to use their individual talents in programs and ministries that interest them in order to nurture their growth as people of faith while providing volunteer services to the community. This is an ecumenical youth

group, open to all youth grades  $8th - 12^{th}$ . The youth group meet at the church on the  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ , and  $4^{th}$  Wednesdays at 6:30 PM.

The J-Walkers have had a great year growing in their faith. They started out this fall gaining a few new members, they replaced the group we had lost to graduation and moving into young adulthood this year. About ten kids regularly attend youth group with the J-Walkers each week, but we are always ready to welcome more kids looking to gain a deeper connection to their Lord.

Some of the highlights of our year this year would be a community supper that we held for free or a freewill donation, we served spaghetti, garlic toast and desserts. We had a great community turnout and served many church members and other community members alike. We also did a leaf cleanup in the city of Lansing, where the kids filled truckloads of leaves from the streets and took them out to the city dump.

The J-Walkers also participated in a 24-hour fast event. During the event we studied different areas of our faith such as prayer, Bible reading, the importance of church and the body of Christ. Between sessions of study the kids had free time as well as some art projects, and games. We spent the night at the church, culminating in a big potluck with the congregation after church. The J-Walkers served the congregation first and then held a dramatic countdown to noon when their 24 hours of fasting were up.


